

Chapter 10 - BUSINESSES

ARTICLE III. – ELECTRONIC DATA TRANSMISSION FOR PAWNBROKERS AND OTHERS SUBJECT TO CHAPTER 66 OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES

Any individual, corporation, joint venture, association or other legal entity, however organized, subject to the provisions of Chapter 66 of the North Carolina General Statutes, including but not limited to “currency converters,” “E-buyers,” “pawnbrokers,” “pawnshops,” “dealers,” and “secondary metals recyclers” as defined in Chapter 66 of the North Carolina General Statutes, shall report all transactions through an electronic data transmission system that is compatible with the computer system of the Craven County Sheriff. The electronic data must be reported to the officer designated by the Craven County Sheriff by 12:00 noon following each regular workday, and within 24 hours after the transaction record is created. No entry made in such database or other approved reporting system shall be erased, obliterated, or defaced. Failure to utilize the electronic data reporting system required by this section shall subject the offender to all penalties provided for in Chapter 66 of the North Carolina General Statutes, including but not limited to Class 2 misdemeanor charges and revocation of the offender’s license.
